Subject: Residential Line Extensions

Dated: March 9, 2006

Replaces: Board Policy No. 407 dated May 10, 1997

I. OBJECTIVE

To establish and state the Cooperative's policy for providing permanent, residential electric service to any potential consumer in the service area of West Kentucky Rural Electric Cooperative Corporation. A permanent, residential service is defined as a service to site built homes, modular homes and pre-manufactured homes that are built on a block foundation with a poured concrete footer.

II. POLICY

1. Overhead line extensions

A. First 800 feet:

- a. Lines will be extended to said consumers at no cost to the consumer.

B. Over 800 feet:

- a. Lines will be extended over 800 feet to consumers named herein provided said consumers pay the full cost of extending the line over 800 feet. This cost is based on \$4.50 per foot for extensions over 800 feet plus right-of-way cost.

- C. The point of measurement will be based upon the shortest distance from an existing line or a public road to the proposed new service. A public road is defined as any road used by the general public which is maintained by a county, city, state or federal government.

2. Underground line extensions

A. First 800 feet:

- a. Lines will be extended to said consumers at the following cost:

Trenching and piping - \$3.00 per foot (\$350.00 minimum)
Wire installation ----- \$3.00 per foot

B. Over 800 feet:

- a. Lines will be extended over 800 feet to consumers at the following cost plus right-of-way cost.

Trenching and piping - \$3.00 per foot (\$350.00 minimum, if not paid in "a"
above)
Wire installation ----- \$7.50 per foot

- C. The point of measurement will be based upon the shortest distance from an existing line or a public road to the proposed new service. A public road is defined as any road used by the general public which is maintained by a county, city, state or federal government.

3. Reimbursements

- A. Any consumer who is charged a fee based on 1. or 2B. above, shall be reimbursed part or all of said fee for a period of up to five years from the date the service is connected for any new consumers receiving service to a permanent residence from the portion of line for which said fee was charged. It is the responsibility of the consumer who paid the fee to notify the cooperative of any new connections. The amount reimbursed shall be determined as follows:
 - a. In the event the permanent residential connection is made directly to the portion of line for which the fee was charged, then the consumer who paid the fee shall receive up to \$3,600.00 in reimbursement.
 - b. In the event a new extension is made from any portion of the line for which the consumer paid the fee, then the consumer shall be reimbursed \$4.50 per foot for the difference between 800 feet and the actual length of the extension.
- B. In no event shall the reimbursement exceed the amount of the fee. No reimbursement shall be made for additional consumers connected after the five year period as mentioned in 3A.
- C. It is understood that no reimbursement shall be made to any consumer who did not pay the fee originally.

III. RESPONSIBILITY


It shall be the responsibility of the President & CEO to assure compliance with this policy.
